Our beautiful lake is available for all property owners in good standing, and their guests, to enjoy.


Please review the information below so that everyone can continue to be safe on the lake!

Feel free to call the office at (662) 224-6671 with any questions or concerns and don't forget to

get your annual Boat Sticker from our office. You can view and download the form from the

Lake News and Regulations page in this website.

- NEVER swim across the lake.
 - Boats may not see your head bobbing in the water
 - When swimming off of your dock or boat stay within 15-20 feet of the dock/boat
 - ALL boats, regardless of size, must display Lot number on the boat
 - Proper location is BOTH sides on the boat, not at the front
- ALWAYS use proper navigational lights when operating at night
 - Red on the Port Side (Left side when on the boat facing forward)
 - o Green on the Starboard Side (Right side when on the boat facing forward)
 - White on the Stern of the boat (Rear of the boat and should be high enough to be seen over motor)
 - The Lake Patrol may ask you to show the lights are operational even during the day as a safety precaution
 - You don't want to realize they do not work when out after dark.

- NEVER navigate the lake with your auxiliary docking lights on ('Headlights")
 - This blinds the operator of oncoming boats
- No motors larger than 9.9 HP
 - Please do not bring a 150HP motor on the lake with the intent of 'only using the trolling motor." Happens all the time! They are asked to leave.

- The by-laws state the navigational distance from docks is 100 feet. We realize that this is not possible on some portions of the lake, especially when passing another boat, docking or when fishing.
 - \circ Guide for safe operation :
 - Stay in the center channel of the lake when operating at the posted max speed of 5 MPH
 - 99 feet to 50 feet- no more than half throttle or 2.5 MPH.
 - 49 feet or less- IDLE SPEED or trolling motors only
 - SLOW down when coming around blind corners
 - stay on the big water side of the lake when passing buoys
 - If you are within 100 feet please watch for residents and guest swimming off their docks, fishing and exiting their boat slips/boat house. The operator with in the 100 ft. is liable if anyone is hit/injured while traveling within 100 feet.
- Be COURTEOUS -
 - Do not pass to close to boats that are anchored
 - You could get the anchor rope caught in your prop or cut the rope
 - Slow down around smaller boats, such as canoes, kayaks, SUPs and fishing boats
- Be SMART-
 - \circ $\,$ Operator is responsible for safe operations and passenger wellbeing.
 - Children should wear life jackets when riding water toys
 - o Stay inside the boat when moving
 - Riding on the front of the boat while hanging your feet over is not safe.
 - Falling off could be deadly
 - Boats do not have brakes
 - The prop may not stop spinning immediately when the engine is shut off- If it's shut off in time.
